Pursuant to Texas Rules of Civil Procedure § 500.10

Regarding Civil Cases

- All Proceedings will be heard via ZOOM (remote hearings/trials (except Jury Trials).
- Jury Trials will resume effective January 01, 2023 and will be in-person.

NOTICE

The Court has implemented ZOOM (remote hearings/trials). If you receive a hearing notice and do **not** have the capability to appear remotely via smart phone, tablet, computer, or landline phone, notify the Court immediately to make alternate arrangements.

Trials/Hearings can be observed by the public in the Courtroom.

PRESENTING EVIDENCE IN CIVIL CASES (Other than Evictions)

Hearings will be set at least 30 days from the time the notice is mailed out. This is to allow time for both parties to present ALL evidence that will be presented to the Court, to the opposing party as well. This should be done in-person or by mail. The Court will not accept evidence presented by email. If presenting photographs as evidence, they must be <u>printed in color</u>. All evidence should be presented to the Court **and the opposing party** no later than **14 days** prior to the hearing. **Failure to provide all evidence to the Court and the opposing party will result in a reset of the hearing or denial of admittance of the evidence**.

PRESENTING EVIDENCE IN EVICTION CASES

All parties must present ALL evidence to the Court and the opposing party. This should be done in person or by mail. The Court will not accept evidence presented by email. If presenting photographs as evidence, they must be <u>printed in color</u>. All evidence should be presented to the Court **and the opposing party** no later than <u>5 days prior</u> to the hearing. Failure to provide all evidence to the Court and the opposing party will result in a reset of the hearing or denial of admittance of the evidence. <u>Photographs must be printed in color</u>
