WARNING: Under Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code 132.001, an unsworn declaration may be used in lieu of a written sworn declaration, verification, certification, oath, or affidavit required by statute or required by a rule, order, or requirement adopted as provided by law. This provision does not apply to a lien required to be filed with a county clerk, an instrument concerning real or personal property required to be filed with a county clerk, or an oath of office or an oath required to be taken before a specified official other than a notary public. An unsworn declaration made under this section must be 1) in writing, 2) signed by the person making the declaration as true under penalty of perjury and 3) in substantially the form used above. Perjury is a crime in Texas. See Texas Penal Code 37.02 and 37.03.

HOW CAN I VERIFY IF SOMEONE IS IN THE MILITARY

1. Please **use the Defense Manpower Data Center's (DMDC) Military Verification Service** to verify if someone is in the military. The website will tell you if the person is currently serving in the military. This will require defendant's date of birth or Social Security number. The site is available 24-hours a day.
2. **What if the Plaintiff does not have a computer ?**

The Plaintiff may request a manual search by mail using the defendant's name and date of birth or Social Security number. Send a request with a self-addressed stamped envelope to:

3. **What if the Plaintiff does not have the defendant's social security number and/or a date of birth ?**

The Plaintiff must file a Military Affidavit which contains a factual basis upon which the court may reasonably conclude that the defendant is or is not a member of the military service. Simply writing **“I have never seen the defendant in a military uniform,”** or **“the defendant never mentioned that he is a military service member.”** The court will not consider these statements. Some factors the court may consider if articulated are:

- a. Whether the defendant has recently been asked if they are a member of the military.
- b. Whether an inquiry has been made of a resident (name required) of the same household who is (an adult 18 or older) as to the defendant's military status.
- c. Whether the defendant's spouse has been asked about the defendant's military status.
- d. Whether a neighbor (name required) has been asked about the defendant's military status.
