
Re: Institution of New Policies and Procedures in the Angelina County Courts at Law

The following is a list of new policies and procedures for the Angelina County Courts at Law:

1. All jury trials and all non-jury trials that require four (4) hours or more will be subject to mandatory mediation. Mediation shall be conducted at least seven (7) days prior to jury selection or at least seven (7) days prior to trial in a non-jury case.
2. In all family law cases involving minor children, viewing of the video "Kids in the Crossfire" will be mandatory for each parent or conservator. The video shall be viewed prior to the first hearing on the merits, including Temporary Restraining Order and Temporary Order hearings.
3. In all cases, unless good cause shown, orders shall be submitted for entry no later than thirty (30) days after rendition of the order.
4. In all divorce cases, when submitting an ex parte temporary restraining order, the order shall be mutual as to the following:
 - a. Communicating with the other party in person, by telephone, or in writing in vulgar, profane, obscene, or indecent language or in a coarse or offensive manner.
 - b. Threatening the other party in person, by telephone, or in writing to take unlawful action against any person.
 - c. Placing one or more telephone calls, anonymously, at any unreasonable hour, in an offensive and repetitious manner, or without a legitimate purpose of communication.
 - d. Causing bodily injury to the other party or to a child of either party.
 - e. Threatening the other party or a child of either party with imminent bodily injury.
 - f. Destroying, removing, concealing, encumbering, transferring, or otherwise harming or reducing the value of the property of one or both of the parties.
 - g. Falsifying any writing or record relating to the property of either party.
 - h. Misrepresenting or refusing to disclose to the other party or to the Court, on proper request, the existence, amount, or location of any property of one or both of the parties.
 - i. Damaging or destroying the tangible property of one or both of the parties, including any document that represents or embodies anything of value.
 - j. Tampering with the tangible property of one or both of the parties, including any document that represents or embodies anything of value, and causing pecuniary loss to the other party.
 - k. Selling, transferring, assigning, mortgaging, encumbering, or in any other manner alienating any of the property of either party, whether personalty or realty, and whether separate or community, except as specifically authorized by the court.
 - l. Incurring any indebtedness, other than legal expenses in connection with this suit, except as specifically authorized by the court.
 - m. Making withdrawals from any checking or savings account in any financial institution for any purpose, except as specifically authorized by the court.
 - n. Spending any sum of cash in the party's possession or subject to the party's control for any purpose, except as specifically authorized by the court.

- o. Withdrawing or borrowing in any manner for any purpose from any retirement, profit-sharing, pension, death, or other employee benefit plan or employee savings plan or from any individual retirement account or Keogh account, except as specifically authorized by the court.
- p. Entering any safe-deposit box in the name of or subject to the control of either party, whether individually or jointly with others.
- q. Withdrawing or borrowing in any manner all or any part of the cash surrender value of life insurance policies on the life of either party, except as specifically authorized by the court.
- r. Changing or in any manner altering the beneficiary designation on any life insurance on the life of either party or the parties' children.
- s. Canceling, altering, failing to renew or pay premiums, or in any manner affecting the present level of coverage of any life, casualty, automobile, or health insurance policies insuring the parties' property or persons, including the parties' children.
- t. Opening or diverting mail addressed to the other party.
- u. Signing or endorsing the other party's name on any negotiable instrument, check, or draft, such as tax refunds, insurance payments, and dividends, or attempting to negotiate any negotiable instrument payable to the other party without the personal signature of the other party.
- v. Taking any action to terminate or limit credit or charge cards in the name of the other party.
- w. Discontinuing or reducing the withholding for federal income taxes on either party's wages or salary while this case is pending.
- x. Destroying, disposing of, or altering any financial records of the parties, including but not limited to records from financial institutions (including canceled checks and deposit slips), all records of credit purchases or cash advances, tax returns, and financial statements.
- y. Destroying, disposing of, or altering any e-mail or other electronic data relevant to the subject matters of this case, whether stored on a hard drive or on a diskette or other electronic storage device.
- z. Terminating or in any manner affecting the service of water, electricity, gas, telephone, cable television, or other contractual services at either party's residence, or in any manner attempting to withdraw any deposits for service in connection with those services.
- aa. Excluding either party from the use and enjoyment of the marital residence.

These new policies and procedures shall become effective May 1, 2007.
