Angelina County will hold two public hearings on a proposal to increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roll in the preceding tax year by 25.25 percent. Your individual taxes may increase at a greater or lesser rate, or even decrease, depending on the change in the taxable value of your property in relation to the change in taxable value of all other property and the tax rate that is adopted.

The first public hearing will be held on September 16, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. at the Angelina County Commissioners Courtroom, 606 E Lufkin Ave, Lufkin, Texas.

The second public hearing will be held on September 20, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. at the Angelina County Commissioners Courtroom, 606 E Lufkin Ave, Lufkin, Texas.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Angelina County last year was \$112,938. Based on last year's tax rate of \$0.437121 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed last year on the average home was \$493.68.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Angelina County this year is \$116,042. If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$0.404880 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$469.83.

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$0.502500 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$583.11.
